What's a Fire Safe Council (FSC)?



- Group of resident volunteers organized to promote <u>fire safety and preparedness</u>
- No financial cost to belong, just volunteer effort
- Calistoga FSC (CFSC) will be independent, but part of Napa Communities Firewise Foundation (NCFF), a 501c3 non-profit. Piper Cole is a Board Member of & liaison with NCFF.
- Project funding for education and fire mitigation via NCFF and grants from various state and local government sources and PG&E

Steps to Organize an FSC

- Form a CFSC, including officers

Steps to Organize an FSC (cont'd)



- Evaluate community risks, mitigation projects and priorities
- Develop a "Community Wildfire Protection Plan" (CWPP) which will make us eligible to apply for grants
- Apply for grants and, if we get grants, begin completing mitigation projects
- Communicate on neighborhood fire safety, provide education


We Welcome Your Involvement
